ASH TREE DIE BACK

You will no doubt be aware that we, Purley Beeches Residents, have a problem with Ash Tree Die Back in the woodland bordering the Oxford Road for which we are responsible. As the trees die, they become unstable and pose a much greater risk to people and to the roads and properties on either side of the woods.

The green corridor between Knowsley Road and The Roebuck has done a great deal to enhance Purley Beeches and bring increased value to properties. Our woods act as a natural barrier to noise and pollution from the Oxford Road and benefit the environment. Our aim is to maintain the woodland and stone walls, but we now need to appeal for help from you.

The attached link to The Good Exchange appealing for funding sets out the problem in greater detail. The Good Exchange has accepted our appeal for funds to help remedy the situation and offered to 'match fund' donations received from donors. *The maximum The Good Exchange will match is £5,000 but this offer will end on 6 July 2024. To date, generous donations from residents of over £1000 have been matched.*

The Chairman and Trustees extend a big thank you to everyone who has made donations so far but more funds are urgently required so that the necessary tree work can commence. You are reminded that, although we have insurance cover, should damage occur caused by trees known to be unstable, all residents would be equally liable.

When you have read the detailed grant application we hope you will feel able to continue to the donations section and support the appeal. If you are a UK taxpayer your donation via Gift Aid will add an additional 25%.

- 2. Confirm if you wish donation to be anonymous or have your name
- 3. Select type of donation from list.
- 4. Select whether you wish us to claim back an additional 25% from gift aid. Read note carefully.
- 5. Select how you want to pay and enter payment details.
- 6. View your donation.

There is also a process by which you can make a cheque donation directly with The Good Exchange. (This will still be matched by The Good Exchange), the form needed is attached and is also available on the PBRA web site.
