The claim, and estimates for the repair, are in hand.

We continue to receive payments by instalments in respect of the costs of the two previous breaches.

We would urge all households who abut a section of the brick and flint boundary wall to undertake repairs; the frost quickly adds to any damage from loose stones. We will be dealing with the wear and tear on PBRA sections.

# ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

# THAMES PATH AT PURLEY – SKERRITT WOOD

There is little progress to report; West Berkshire Council appear unwilling to address any of the issues which cause us concern and it seems likely that they will move to a Creation Order, to which we will be able to object. In order to emphasise the Association's ownership of the land it has been decided to close the footpath once a year, for a short period. This was done in December 2009.

#### TREE MAINTENANCE

A quote for the inspection and creation of a 5 year maintenance plan for the trees has been agreed; the tree surgeon has agreed to begin once Spring is underway and it is clear where any damaged or dead trees may be.

#### NEWS ITEMS

We have had reports of rats in Marshall Close and Hazel Road; residents may want to check their garages and sheds, and perhaps reduce the amount of food scraps put out for the birds.

Long-standing residents may remember Bill and Mary Senior, founder members of the PBRA, who used to live in 3 Marshall Close; Bill Senior has been in contact to say that his wife Mary died last Thursday after a long illness. Our sympathies are with him.
